Explore some of our favorite campus highlights


We're so glad you're exploring our beautiful Columbus campus! We welcome you to make yourself at home and join current students as they crisscross campus on their way to class, the library, the gym, or their residence or dining hall. Feel free to enter any building that interests you — with the exception of residence halls and classrooms in session. Enjoy your visit!

- The Ohio Union is a great place to start your tour. There's ample parking and a great info desk in the lobby for advice and questions. The heart of student life on campus, this is where many student organizations meet and where students come to eat, study and relax. You'll find the Undergraduate Admissions Welcome Center here, as well as the Student Life Center for Student Leadership and Service, and Barnes & Noble Bookstore.
- This historic building opened in 1911 as Ohio State's first student union.

 Today, Hale Hall is home to Ohio State's hallmark Morrill Scholarship Program.

 Be sure to check out the impressive art collection on the first floor!
- You'll find the University Honors and Scholars Center here at **Kuhn Honors** and Scholars House, formerly the home of university presidents.
- Originally fed by a natural spring,
 Mirror Lake figured prominently in the
 site selection for the university in 1870.
 Mirror Lake Hollow includes Browning
 Amphitheatre, Bucket and Dipper
 Rock, the Faculty Club and Pomerene
 Hall all great campus landmarks
 worth discovering.
- Orton Hall was built in 1893 using 40 kinds of Ohio stone, layered as in nature: with the oldest on bottom. And

- while crossing the Oval, you're sure to hear the Orton Hall Chimes they've serenaded students for over 100 years. Plus, you'll want to see Orton Geological Museum and greet Elvisaurus, our resident cryolophosaurus ellioti.
- 6 Page Hall is home to our John Glenn
 College of Public Affairs. Check out
 a piece of the moon and some of the
 astronaut's mementos in the lower level.
- 7 The Wexner Center for the Arts is an internationally renowned research lab and center for contemporary art, film, dance and other performances. Admission to the galleries is free. While you're there, stop by the Wexner Center store or grab a bite at Heirloom Cafe. Check wexarts.org for hours.
- Our new state-of-the-art Timashev
 Family Music Building houses the
 Ohio State School of Music, offering an
 innovative space for music education,
 performance and research.
- 9 The Oval, the open grassy area stretching from Thompson Library to College Road, has symbolized Ohio State to students and visitors for generations. Legend has it that if you take the "Long Walk" from the seal at the east end to the William Oxley Thompson statue on the west end while holding hands with your sweetheart, you'll be together forever.



- Hopkins Hall is home to fine art, industrial design and art education classes. Visit the Hopkins Hall Gallery to view exhibits by students, faculty and visiting artists.
- Originally built in 1873, University Hall used to be every Buckeye's one-stop shop. It was a library, classrooms, chapel and dorm. Today you see a replica of that building that retains the original clock tower, entrance and pillars.
- The William Oxley Thompson
 Memorial Library, Ohio State's main
 library, sees thousands of students
 daily. Walk through the beautiful Grand
 Reading Room, and take the elevator to
 the 11th floor for spectacular views of
 campus and downtown Columbus.
- The Recreation and Physical Activity
 Center or RPAC (say: R-pack) is a
 state-of-the-art recreation center
 and one of six recreational facilities
 on campus. Staying fit is easy here!
 Students also get a splash out of the
- McCorkle Aquatic Pavilion, taking advantage of the pools, diving well, hot tub and saunas. You can get a visitors pass to tour the facility at the RPAC Welcome Desk.
- Ohio Stadium, completed in 1922, was the first horseshoe-shaped, doubledeck stadium in the United States.

 Nicknamed "The 'Shoe," the stadium holds approximately 105,000 wildly cheering Buckeyes.
- 15 Scott Laboratory is actually three buildings joined by an elevated walkway. The building houses labs, a machine shop and classrooms for the Department of Mechanical and Aeronautical Engineering.

- The Enarson Classroom Building is home to the Office of International Affairs. OIA supports international students and scholars and facilitates international opportunities for Ohio State students and faculty. Come here when you're ready to study abroad.
- 17 Knowlton Hall is where you'll find the School of Architecture and ksa cafe. You may want to check out the roof garden, accessible from the fourth floor.
- This section of campus is home to our nationally ranked Fisher College of Business, and includes the Blackwell Inn, a four-star hotel.
- The Student Academic Services
 Building is home to undergraduate,
 graduate and professional admissions
 offices and Buckeye Link a onestop shop for taking care of Buckeye
 business.

- This area is the center of academic life for Ohio State's College of Food, Agricultural and Environmental Sciences. Nearby field-based classrooms like Chadwick Arboretum, Waterman Farm and the Olentangy River Wetlands provide a rich environment for hands-on learning and research.
- 21 If you're looking for a peaceful place to walk or relax, visit Chadwick
 Arboretum and Learning Gardens.
- Study, hang out or grab lunch at the College of Food, Agricultural and Environmental Sciences Library and Student Success Center. The collaboration rooms are great for group study or connecting with faculty and recruiters.

- The Green Roof on Howlett Hall is a model of sustainability, keeping over 200,000 gallons of polluted water out of nearby Olentangy River each year. And with an impressive view toward downtown Columbus, it's one of students' favorite campus features.
- This section of campus is home to the College of Veterinary Medicine.
 Established in 1885, it is one of the oldest—and most highly ranked—veterinary colleges in the country.
 Ohio State's comprehensive Veterinary Medical Center provides medical care to more than 35,000 animals each year.

- Our **Athletics District** (top left corner of the map) is home to:

 - Jack Nicklaus Golf Museum
 - Jesse Owens Memorial Stadium (track and field)
 - Ty Tucker Tennis Facility
 - Woody Hayes Athletic Center
